

## **DEA - REVENUES FROM LOCAL, STATE, & FEDERAL SOURCES**

The major share of all financial support for local school districts is raised by taxing property. Most of the financial support of public education, therefore, is subject to a direct vote of the people.

It is the responsibility of the Board to explain the objectives and needs of the schools to appropriate community bodies that have a role in school budget adoption, and to the voters of the District.

The Board, administration, and the professional staff will work with the taxpayers toward the solution of problems in the operational funding of the School District.

The Board will:

Accept all available state funds to which the District is entitled by law or through rules of the State Board of Education, and

Accept all federal funds, which are available providing there is a specific need for them and that matching funds required are available. The Superintendent in accepting such funds shall certify that:

1. The District nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any Federal department or agency as required by federal law.
2. The District did not engage in lobbying to influence or attempt to influence an officer or employee of any federal agency or member and/or employee of Congress in connection with the making of any Federal grant, cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal grant or cooperative agreement.
3. The District when issuing statements, press releases, requests for proposals, bid solicitations, and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or part with Federal money, will clearly state the percentage of costs funded with Federal money, the dollar amount of Federal funds, and the balance to be financed by non-governmental sources.

The Board may accept revenues on a case-by-case basis consistent with the goals, policies and programs of the District.
