

IKC- GRADE REPORTING & CLASS RANK FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

This policy is intended to encourage Epping High School Students to take the most challenging of courses available without penalizing those students for doing so.

GRADING POLICIES - Grade point average (GPA) and class rank are weighted based on the chart below.

WEIGHTED GRADE POINT AVERAGE - A student's GPA is determined by multiplying the grade point value by the credits earned for each individual class, totaling the grade points earned, and then dividing the total grade pointes earned by the total credits attempted.

WEIGHTED CLASS RANK – Class rank is determined by putting the GPA's of all students in a class in rank order from highest to lowest. In the year of graduation, ranking in a class would be based on the eligible quarter grades.
