SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

The town of Epping, population 7125, is located in Rockingham County in southern New Hampshire. Epping is 60 miles north of Boston, MA and 25 miles east of Manchester, NH. The Epping School District serves approximately 900 students in grades PreK through 12. In grades 9-12 at Epping Middle High School, there are more than 80 courses in 13 disciplines. Students also have the opportunity to enroll in courses at the Seacoast School of Technology in Exeter, NH.

STANDARD ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Our academic programs provide students with a college, career, and life preparatory curriculum. These courses require analysis, critical thinking, and a commitment to meeting high academic standards. Per the NH Department of Education Public School Standards, high school credit is awarded through meeting courses competencies. Competency is defined as the understanding and application of key concepts and skills within and across content areas. Epping High School embeds the Work Study Practices into the curriculum; every student is assessed in the areas of Self-Direction, Communication, Collaboration, and Innovation. In addition to academic classes, student have a weekly Advisory and daily Flex block. Advisory is where students work on developing executive functioning skills and community building. Flex gives students the opportunity to partake in enrichment activities, remediate with teachers, and assemble for meetings and presentations.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Epping Middle High School offers differentiated diplomas: District Standard, Honors, and State Standard. Requirements for each diploma can be found in the Program of Studies on the EMHS website. Requirements for the Epping District Standard Diploma include:

GPA, Class Ranking, & Latin Honors

A student's GPA is determined by multiplying the weighted grade point value by the credits earned for each individual class, totaling the grade points earned, and then dividing the total grade points earned by the total credits attempted.

Class rank is the order of weighted GPA's in a graduating class from highest to lowest. As of the 2021-2022 school year, EMHS will no longer recognize achievement by class ranking but will instead apply the Latin Honors System to award graduation honors:

Cum Laude = 3.50 or higher Magna Cum Laude = 3.75 or higher Summa Cum Laude = 4.00 or higher

Class of 2023 SAT Data

All juniors in the state of NH are required to take the SAT in the spring of 11th grade. The chart below displays the EMHS Class of 2023's average scores of all required test-takers and the average score of the Class of 2023's college-bound test takers from the Spring 2021 test administration. College-bound status is determined by the completion of Algebra II or higher by the end of junior year. The number of test takers is noted in each section:

Advanced Placement & Honors Courses

Advanced Placement courses are available in US History, Statistics, Calculus AB, Chemistry, English Literature & Composition, and English Language & Composition. Some AP courses are offered every year and others are on alternating years as needed. Dual-Enrollment college credit is available in Quantitative Reasoning and College Composition as well as in numerous courses at the Seacoast School of Technology

Dedicated Honors sections are available in Biology, Geometry, Algebra II, English IV, Spanish IV/V, and French IV/V. An "Honors Option" is available in college prep core classes when no dedicated honors section exists. Honors Option gives students the opportunity to take a more rigorous course of study by completing a more in-depth study of the content.

Epping High School's Grading & Reporting System

In September 2018, Epping Middle High School transitioned to a full competency-based grading and reporting system. Students are assessed in multiple competencies per course, typically 4-6 competencies per semester. These competency grades, which must all be passing to earn credit, are averaged together to determine a final course grade for each semester. The chart below displays the grade points associated with each grade by course level.
