A Parent's Guide 2 When to Return to School



Check for any New/Unexplained* Symptoms at home or in school



SYMPTOMS

- Fever (100F) or chills
- Feels feverish
- Cough, shortness of breath
- Sore throat, nasal congestion, MIS-C symptoms: or runny nose
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches

- Headache
- Nausea/vomiting
- Diarrhea
- rash, neck pain bloodshot eyes abdominal pain
- * If student has a documented chronic condition that accounts for symptoms, they are not considered "new/unexplained."

If yes at home... Isolate at home

If yes at school... Students will be dismissed

Positive Test

10 days after SYMPTOM onset

AND

24 hours of NO fever (without use of meds)

AND

Symptoms have improved

*Before returning to school, you must contact the school nurse directly and send in your child's Covid-19 test results AND/OR written documentation of an alternative diagnosis from the physician that explains the student's symptoms to the school nurse.

Negative Test

Get COVID-19 Test

24 hours of NO fever (without use of meds)

AND

Symptoms have improved

No Test

10 days after **SYMPTOM** onset

AND

24 hours of NO fever (without use of meds)

AND

Symptoms have improved

OR

Doctor's note indicating alternative diagnosis

Without a COVID-19 test or alternative diagnosis from the physician, the earliest date we would expect your child to return to school is:

Please contact the school nurse if you have any questions or concerns.

10-Day Quarantine** if...

- Exposed to someone confirmed or suspected of having COVID-19
- Traveled outside New England AND have a negative PCR test on or after day 7 _

***If you choose not to have a Covid-19 PCR test than you will need to follow the 14 day quarantine guidance.
